Patent Preparation & Prosecution Practice is simultaneously a definitive working Treatise for the practicing attorney and a self-training Treatise for those interested in specializing in patent law. It comprises six hard-cover, typeset, loose-leaf volumes made up of 25 chapters covering 1200 pages of text, examples, hypotheticals, forms, practical instruction and a complete table of cases as well as 60 pages of detailed tables of contents. The price of \$375.00 also includes a seventh volume of questions and answers keyed to the subjects of the chapters.

The Treatise is designed for the self-training of patent practitioners. It is encyclopedic but it is not in encyclopedia format. It is organized to permit the beginner to start with page one and to master the whole story by studying through to the last page of the last volume. Most subjects are treated many times throughout the book with a progressive increase in sophistication so that layers of knowledge are built up as the reader acquires understandings.

At every point in the Treatise every word and concept needed to understand the exposition has already been previously explained or is explained then and there.

Differences in views of the law among the Circuits of the Courts of Appeals, the U.S. Court of Customs and Patent Appeals and the Patent Office are laid bare. Reasons for the differences are explained. The Patent Office position is always fully articulated for those who plan to take the Patent Office Examination for admission to practice. Every subject ever covered on past Patent Office exams is treated and much more.

The first annual update — revision — supplement to the Treatise will be published and distributed prior to July 31, 1977. PRG policy is to provide the annual revision free of charge for purchases of the Treatise within three months of publication of the annual revision.
